Morgan State Notables...

BEARS HOST NAVY IN HOME-OPENER AT HILL FIELD HOUSE CLASSIC

Morgan State enters its home opener by hosting Patriot League opponent Navy on Wednesday night. While Morgan State has yet to win in its first seven games, the Bears hold a 10-1 record at Hill Field House since the 2004-05 season. The Bears look to avenge last year's loss to the Mids in Annapolis (77-67), it marked the team's first matchup in history. The Mids will enter Hill Field House fresh off its first win of the season when they overcame a nine-point halftime deficit and outlasted Howard 82-73 in the MCI Center at the BB&T Classic.

- Morgan State enters the season with four capable upperclassmen, an improved bench and a promising freshman class. The Bears enter the 2005-06 season ranked No. 9 in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Preseason Poll.

- Coach Alfred "Butch" Beard led his Bears to a 10-1 home record and 9 consecutive wins at Hill Field House during the 2004-05 season.

- Morgan State will play one of the toughest schedules in the history of the program. The Bears schedule features games against: Washington, Miami, Virginia Tech, Seton Hall Florida, and MSU will host George Washington at Hill Field House.

- Head coach Butch Beard is in his 5th season with the Bears and currently has a record of 35-86. He also has an overall record of 86-154 in his seven years as a collegiate head coach. Beard earned MEAC Coach of the Year honors for his teams' success in 2002-03, and in 1991-92 as head coach of Howard University after guiding the Bison to both the regular season and postseason titles and a trip to the NCAA Tournament.

- Coach Beard was a former roommate of Baltimore/Washington Bullet Wes Unseld at the University of Louisville. Beard spent 10 seasons in the NBA, averaging 9.3 points per game in 605 games with five different teams. He was a first-round selection (10th overall) with the Atlanta Hawks in 1969.

Bears Finished The Regular Season Ranked 4th Place: The Morgan State Bears finished tied for 4th place in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference following a win against Coppin State.

Road Kill: Dating back to the beginning of the 2003-04 season, the Bears have struggled to get a win on the road. The Bears only three victories away from Hill Field House were against Howard (Jan. 10, 2004), Bethune-Cookman (Feb. 17, 2004) and Coppin State (Mar. 5). Morgan State finished with a 3-12 overall road record. So far this season, MSU has gone 0-6 on the road with losses to Washington, UNC-Greensboro, Northern Arizona, Miami, Virginia Tech and Towson.

The Canadian Assassin: Karanvir Aujla has been nothing but a solid contributor for the Bears throughout his career. Last season, the Montreal native played in 25-of-29 games and lit it up from 3-point territory as knocked down 36-of-87 (41%) of his attempts from beyond the arc...ranked No. 14 in 3-point field goals made (1.5/game). He recorded his best game of the season against Florida A&M and scored 14 points. He averaged 6 ppg, 1.7 rebounds. This season the silky smooth shooter will be called upon to become more of a team leader to rally a young Bears team. Aujla will see more minutes this season, which should equal more points. Aujla has missed games against Miami, Virginia Tech, Towson and Maine due to an injury to his hand.

Mount Berkley: This season Morgan State's starting 6'8" center **Timothy Berkley** will be a major player in the success of coach Beard's young squad. Berkley is coming off a season in which he averaged 18.8 minutes per game, 4.1 ppg and 4.1 rebounds. Berkley recorded the best game of his career against Md- Eastern Shore where he led the Bears with 16 points and had four boards. Berkley recorded five rebounds and collected two blocks against A&T and had a career-high 4 blocks against Howard (2/12). Through seven games, Berkley is averaging 5.4 ppg, 4.6 rpg and has shot 16-of-38 (42.1%) from the field. The Richmond, VA native had his best game of the season last when he scored 10 points and grabbed a team-high 7 rebounds against the Miami Hurricanes. Berkley matched his 7-board performance with 5 points against Virginia Tech. The Bears will depend on Tim to become a more consistent defender and rebounder, and will look for him to provide more points in the scoring department.

New Cubs In The Den: Morgan State will enter its first contest of the season with a host of young new faces. The Bears return with four experienced players, but have added eight new players to the roster. With an entire squad made of his own hand-picked players, Beard and his staff have worked on developing and improving their skills. The Bears will take the floor this season expecting to weather the storm of a tough schedule.

Home In The Cave - Hill Field House: Morgan State's home venue, Hill Field House, is one of the best facilities in the conference. The Bears have posted a 15-3 record in Hill Field House since the 2003-04 season. The Bears finished off the 2004-05 regular season with an impressive 10-1 home record. The one blemish to its home record came in a loss against Coppin State (L, 62-66, 12/9/2004).

Great "O": The Morgan State Bears were the No. 3 scoring offense in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference last season. The Bears averaged 67.6 points per game against MEAC opponents and shot 42.8 percent from the field during the 2004-05 season.

ORONO, Maine. -- Philippe Tchekane Bofia scored 10 points and pulled down 13 rebounds to lead the University of Maine past Morgan State 74-38 on Tuesday night at Alfond Arena in front of 1,090 fans. The Black Bears improved to 2-5 on the season, while Morgan State falls to 0-7.

Maine took a 31-24 lead into half, but was able to outscore Morgan State 43-14 in the second half. The Black Bears opened the second half on a 15-3 run to turn a seven point lead into a 19 point advantage just five minutes into the second half. The Black Bears used key long range shooting in the second half to cruise past Morgan State. Maine hit 7-of-12 shots from behind the three-point arc in the second half.

With a 43-27 lead, Jon Sheets, Freddy Petkus and Ernest Turner combined to hit four straight three-point field goals in the span of just over three minutes as the Black Bears increased their lead to 52-28.

With the Black Bears draining shots from the outside, it opened up the inside and Maine was able to go inside and find Olli Ahvenniemi, who eight of his 10 points in the second half.

Maine, who shot 50 percent from the floor in the second half, limited Morgan State to just 20 percent in the second half as they connected on just 5-of-25 shots. The Black Bears, who outrebounded Morgan State 54-35 in the game, held a 32-8 advantage in the second half alone.

The Black Bears were led by Tchekane Bofia's double-double with 10 points and 13 rebounds. It was the first double-double for a Maine player this season. Ernest Turner had 13 points and five rebounds. Sheets added 12 points for the Black Bears as he drained 4-of-6 three-point field goals. Chris Bruff chipped in with 10 points and six rebounds, while Olli Ahvenniemi added eight points and 10 boards. Rashard Turner added a career-high seven assists to go along with five points and three rebounds.

Maine shot 37.5 percent in the game, while Morgan State connected 29.6 percent of the time. The Black Bears hit 10-of-21 shots from three-point range.

Joseph McLean led Morgan State with nine points, while Timothy Berkley added six points and a team-high nine rebounds for the Bears.

Trey Notes: Last year, MSU had the best three-point percentage in the MEAC connecting on 71-of-199 3-pointers (.357) and knocking down 6.0 3-pointers per game. This season the Bears have connected on 24-of-80 3-pointers (.300) and have been led sophomore **Timothy "T.J." Mathis (.381)** and junior **Joseph McLean (.417)**. The duo had their best shooting nights at Towson...Mathis knocked down 4-of-8 from beyond the arc, while McLean nailed 3-of-4 from 3-point territory,

Dishing It Out: The Bears were one of the best at distributing the "rock" in the MEAC last season. Morgan State is ranked No. 2 in the MEAC in the assist category and averaged 12 assists per contest. Former Bear Chris Grant led the Bears with 2.6 assists per game, followed by returners **Joseph McLean** with 2.0 apg and **T.J. Mathis** with 1.4 apg. McLean and Mathis currently lead the Bears dishing out 2.7 assists per game.

The Answer Is The Line: Last year Morgan State had a hard time knocking down free throws at the charity stripe. The Bears finished the season shooting a dismal 61% of its free throws. In order for the Bears to have any success in winning close contests, especially on the road, they must make the most of their free throw opportunities. During the 2004-05 season, the Bears shot 55% from the line on the road, and 63% at home. MSU is currently shooting 58.9% from the charity stripe.

Scouting Navy: The Midshipmen of Navy finished the 2004-05 season with a 9-19 overall record, 5-9 tied for 6th in the Patriot League.



• Navy head coach Billy Lange is entering his second season as the leader of the Midshipmen. Under Lange the Mid's improved their winning ways by four games...and even in 10 of the games they lost they only lost by a total of six points or less.

• The Midshipmen starting backcourt features two members of the 2005 Patriot League All-Rookie Team. Sophomore guards Corey Johnson who averaged 9.6 ppg, 3.9 rpg, and 3.1 apg, and Greg Sprink averaged 8.9 ppg, 5.1 rpg, 1.6 apg last season.

• The Midshipmen pride themselves in pounding the boards. Navy was the top offensive rebounding team last season, averaging 42.4 rpg. It marked the first time since 1999-00 (41.2 rpg) that Navy averaged 40- plus rebounds in Patriot League play.

• Midshipmen are led by 6-6, 223-pound senior Matt Fannin. The Lakewood, OH native finished the 2005-06 season as Navy's scoring and rebounding leader averaging 10.9 ppg and 6.7 rpg. Fannin currently leads Navy by averaging 6.6 rebounds per game, along with 6.6 points.

• Navy has opened the 2005-06 season with a 1-4 record. The Mids were defeated by Georgetown (72-49), fell at Arkansas-Little Rock by a score of 61-57, and dropped a close game to Air Force (64-55) and Penn (86-73). Navy posted its first win of the season against Howard (82-73) in the BB&T Classic.

• The Mids have been led in scoring by Corey Johnson. Johnson, a 6-1, 194-pounder, is the team's leading scorer averaging 14.7 ppg and 3 rpg from his guard position. Kaleo Kina, a junior guard from Peekskill, NY, is the Mids second leading scorer averaging 9.0 ppg and is shooting 45 percent from 3-point territory.

• Clif Colbert scored 16 points to help Navy rally to a win in the second half against MEAC opponent Howard. Colbert shot 5-for-12 from the field and 5-for-6 from the charity stripe in 35 minutes of action against the Bison.

• Navy had a tough time keeping track on the "rock". Despite 30 turnovers (11 by Kina Kaleo), the Mids were still able to come away with a win against Howard.

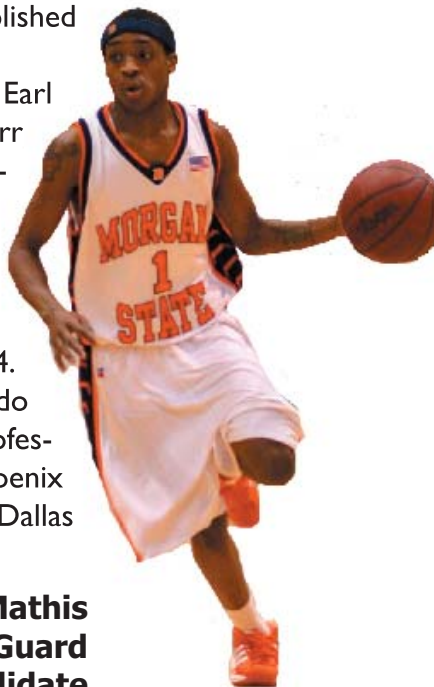
Morgan State on the Tube:

Bear Bits:

- The Bears finished the 2004-05 season with an 8-2 record when shooting 50% or better from the field.
- MSU's 94 points against UMES (3/1/05) were the most in any game last season. The last time Morgan State scored at least 90 points was during the 2003-04 season in a 106-72 win against Florida A&M.
- Morgan State posted a 2-14 record when trailing at halftime... and were 11-2 when leading at halftime last season.
- Morgan State posted a 6-2 record when it has had two Bears finish in double-figures.
- In 2004-05, Morgan State ranked No. 6 in the MEAC in steals averaging 7.8 per game.
- The 11 MEAC wins last season were most MSU wins since the 1998-99 season, when it went 12-5 in the conference.
- The Bears posted a 10-4 record when scoring 70 or more points.
- The Bears shot 52.9% (36-68) from the floor in the victory against Md-Eastern Shore on 3/1. It marked their highest field goal percentage of the season. The previous high was 52% vs. UMES on 1/24/05.
- Attendance at MSU home games has increased each of Beard's four seasons. An average of 2,182 fans showed up in Hill Field House last year, while the team posted an impressive 10-1 home record.
- The Bears must build upon last year's postseason experience to make a return to the MEAC Championship -- something that has not been accomplished since 1977.
- Morgan State University President Earl S. Richardson appointed Floyd Kerr as the university director of athletics. Kerr was the athletic director as Southern University from 2000-04. He was ranked 75th on Sports Illustrated's 101 Most Important Minorities in Sports in June 2004. Kerr was an All-American at Colorado State and was drafted by three professional sports teams, including the Phoenix Suns (NBA), Utah Stars (ABA) and Dallas Cowboys (NFL).

When the Bears say they will play anyone anywhere at anytime, they really mean it. When Morgan State plays the Black Bears on Wednesday, MSU will have officially traveled more than 10,000 miles already in the young season.



• **Forcing the Action**

- Morgan State is forcing 15.4 turnovers per game with its full-court and half-court pressure defense, while averaging 7.6 steals per contest.
- The Bears Beard forced a season-high 12 against UNC-Greensboro which resulted in 14 Morgan State points.
- For the season, the Bears are averaging 11 points off turnovers per contest, while the opposition has scored an average of 22.1 points off turnovers each game.

• **Protect the Possession**

- The Bears are averaging 20.3 turnovers per game and rank 10th in the conference with a -4.83 turnover margin.
- Morgan State also ranks 9th in the MEAC with a 0.57 turnover ratio.
- Morgan State has more assists than turnovers in 1-of-5 games this season.

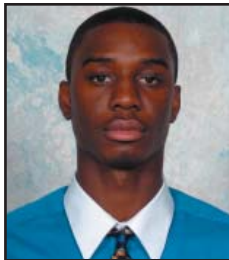

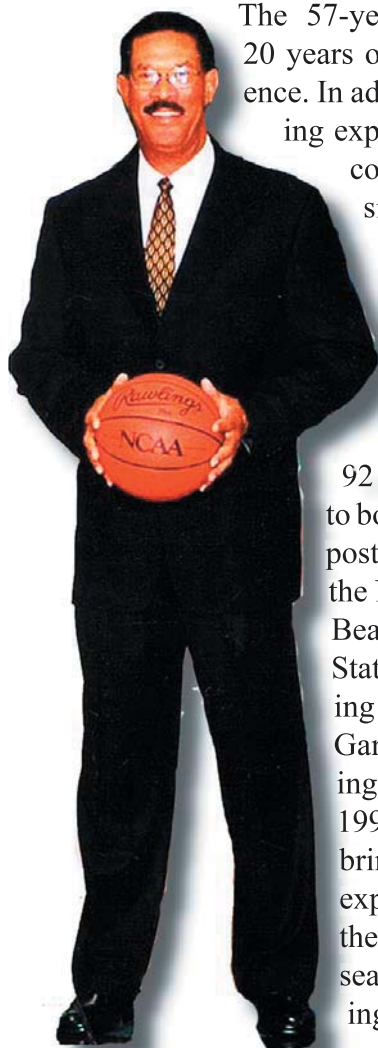

Alfred “Butch” Beard Head Coach

Alfred “Butch” Beard was hired as Morgan State’s 14th basketball coach in 2001. This season Beard is looking to build upon the success of last year in which he finished with the school’s best overall record since the Bears finished with a 14-14 record during the 1998-99 season. He guided the Bears to a 14-16 record in 2004-05, 11-7 in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference, and posted an impressive 10-1 home court record at Hill Field House.



The 57-year old Beard has over 20 years of NBA coaching experience. In addition to his NBA coaching experience, Beard was head coach at Howard University from 1990-94. During his tenure with the Bison, Beard earned Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Coach of the Year honors for his teams’ success in 1991-92 after guiding the Bison to both the regular season and postseason titles and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. Beard joined the Morgan State program after serving as an Assistant Coach to Gar Heard with the Washington Wizards during the 1999-2000 NBA season. He brings NBA head coaching experience having guided the New Jersey Nets for two seasons (1994-96) compiling a 60-104 record. He

also served as an assistant coach for two seasons with the Nets (1988-90), three (1972-82) and two seasons with the Dallas Mavericks (1996-98).



A former roommate of Baltimore/Washington Bullet fame, Wes Unseld at the University of Louisville, Beard

spent 10 seasons in the NBA, averaging 9.3 points per game in 605 games with five different teams. A first round selection (10th overall) with the Atlanta Hawks in 1969, Beard’s best season was in 1971-72 with the Cavaliers when he scored 15.8 points and earned a trip to the NBA All-Star game. He was the starting guard for the 1973-74 Golden State Warriors championship team.

Beard also spent five seasons as a broadcaster with the New York Knicks in the mid-eighties.

Beard resides in Burtonsville, Maryland and has four children; Alfred III, Cory, Samantha and Ian.
